Rules

There are 13 questions altogether. The first question is a warm-up and worth one point.

The other 12 questions are each worth 2 points


That's a max of 25 points!



Your **best 4 scores** will count.

So, don't worry if you miss one Friday, you can still win.

Maximum Score is 100 points.



If you get an answer almost right or half right, teacher will award one point instead of two points.


For example, suppose the question is:

“Name two colours of the rainbow”

and you write “Red and brown.”

Red is right, but brown is not.

You would earn 1 point!



Don't worry too much about **spelling**. If your answer is right, you'll get the points so long as your spelling is close enough.

Unless, of course, it's a spelling question!

It can be helpful to listen to the news and sports news.
